Safe and orderly migration

77.5% associate safe migration with securing a job with a good company

This was especially the case in the districts of **Jhenaidah** and **Madaripur**





50.7% of all respondents would bring a passport, work visa and contract

14.7% would bring a passport and a visa



45.3% thinks that migrating with a proper work visa generates a better income and will ensure greater protection

Preferred source of assistance for migration



Most migrants prefer to migrate through their social networks

71% intends to migrate through relatives and

19% through the help of a broker

Labour rights



Freedom from forced labour Freedom from child labour Freedom from discrimination at work Freedom to form and join a union and to bargain collectively Only **18.8%** of all respondents had a good level of knowledge on the indicators listed in labour standards

Labour contract



Only **21.5**% of all respondents had a good level of knowledge on the contents of a labour contract

Sources of assistance in emergency situation



In cases of emergency, 51.75% of migrants would contact their embassy or consulate, while 44.2% would contact friends and family
