Profile of potential migrants

90.7% had the intention to migrate in the near future

9.3% did not want to migrate, but was considering to do so

to support their family

Profile of returned migrants

The majority of returned migrants were male 78% and a smaller percentage female 28%*


65.3% of all respondents were between the ages of 18-29

Migrants are generally low educated. Majority of migrants with only

36.2% of all respondents completing primary education: 36.7% of potential migrants completing primary education and 34.1% of returned migrants completing primary education

> Most migrants are unemployed 35.7% or self-employed and engaged in seasonal or piecemeal work 43.7%

The average household of potential migrants is 5.57%

For 12.7% of all respondents, money is sometimes not enough to buy food	12.7	12.2	14.3

- 31.8% of all respondents experienced unemployment
- 22.2% of all respondents experienced serieus illness in the family

- 18% was unable to pay back debts
- **16.8%** experienced crop failures
- 10.3% experienced a natural disaster
