SUSTAINABLE APPROACHES FOR NEW WELFARE SERVICES AND LABOR MARKET INFORMATION SYSTEMS

IOM – in close partnership with ILO – will conduct a mapping of services available for migrant workers at the various stages of the migration cycle, identifying gaps and new services required. Based on this, a framework of services will be designed outlining the recommendations for the Wage Earners' Welfare Board (WEWB) to assist with more targeted services and facilities for migrant workers.

A further study on persons with disabilities in the labour migration process, disabilities arising from working conditions best practices to redress migrant workers affected by occupational hazards will be conducted. A report will be designed with recommendations to assist the government in developing a policy framework with more target oriented services to facilitate labour migration.

IOM will assist the MoEWOE and Bureau of Manpower Employment and Training (BMET), to develop a guideline for a comprehensive labour market information system in Bangladeshi.

Outcome 1:

Men and women migrant workers are better protected through improved policies.

Outcome 2:

Public and private institutions ensure safe migration and decent work for men and women migrants.
